

TOWNSHIP OF BORDENTOWN

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BORDENTOWN
TO PROHIBIT PARKING FOR SNOW PLOWING AND SNOW REMOVAL
ORDINANCE NO. 2003- 08**

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Bordentown has determined that heavy snow in sufficient quantities creates a public-safety problem when cars are parked on the street in snow-emergency routes in the Township of Bordentown; and

WHEREAS, there is no current method of ensuring the removal of these cars for the purpose of efficient snow removal during severe winter storms.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Bordentown, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that a state of emergency has been declared by the Township of Bordentown's Office of Emergency Management, then no vehicle shall be parked on the following streets or highways or portions thereof:

- Adirondak Road
- Cayuga Road
- Longview Drive
- Meadow Run Drive
- Rising Sun Road - from Hedding Road to Rt. 130 North
- Hedding Road - from Rising Sun Road to Mansfield Township Line

- Durns Mill Road - between Rt. 130 and Rt. 206
- Municipal Drive
- Clifton Mill Drive
- Holloway Lane / Williamsburg Drive
- Yorktown Road
- Constitution Drive
- Cemetery Lane
- Thornton Lane
- Charles Bossert Drive
- Ward Avenue
- Amboy Road / Klein Drive
- Van Drive - between Amboy Road and East Drive
- East Drive
- Maple Avenue
- Groveville Road

Hogback Road – from Groveville Road to Rt. 130 North
Honeyflower Drive
Mission Road
Carmen Avenue
Bywater Road
Glen Road – Cedar Hill Road – East and West Edgewood Road

2. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage that may result from such removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.

3. The effectiveness of this ordinance is contingent upon signs being erected as required by law.

4. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation or provision of this ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both.
