



# Down Syndrome Clinical Investigation

The Department of Medical Genetics at Duke University Medical Center is conducting a research study of the effects of an investigational medication developed by F. Hoffmann-La Roche Ltd, a pharmaceuticals company, to enhance cognitive function. Dr. Priya Kishnani is the principal investigator for this study.

The primary purpose of this study is to investigate the medication's safety, and the secondary purpose is to see if the medication can improve memory, attention, and daily living skills in adults with Down syndrome.

The study will take place over a 4-5 month period. Participants attend nine outpatient visits to Duke University Medical Center in Durham, NC with their primary caregivers. During each visit, study-related medical testing is completed. Study-related psychological testing is completed at some of the visits. Some of the visits may require an overnight stay in a local hotel. The assessments, medication, and medical care related to the study are provided free of charge. Travel costs are reimbursed, and a \$150/visit stipend is provided to compensate for meals, additional costs, and time.
