Key Facts:

- Founded in 1977, Gleaners is one of the oldest and largest food banks in the country. Gleaners is proud to be a founding member of Feeding America and the Food Bank Council of Michigan.
- Gleaners distributes donated and purchased food to more than 550 schools, soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, senior homes and other partner agencies that feed hungry people.
- Over two thirds of Gleaners' food – about 29 million pounds annually – is distributed at no cost to our partner agencies. The rest is provided at a shared maintenance fee of 18 cents per pound (which helps offset the costs of handling and transportation) and through our purchased food program.
- Of every dollar donated, Gleaners uses 94 cents for food and food programs. One dollar provides three meals for a hungry neighbor.
- Gleaners is governed by a board of directors and an advisory board comprised of civic and business leaders and partner agency representatives.
