Michigan Sportsmen Against Hunger

Since 1991, the Michigan Sportsmen Against Hunger (MSAH) has been working to create linkages between donors, wild game processors, and charities that feed needy individuals. MSAH is an all-volunteer organization and is led by sportsmen and women concerned about making a positive difference in the community. Wild game can provide an important source of protein for hungry people served by Gleaners Community Food Bank.

How to Donate Game:

- Check the “processor” page at www.sportsmenagainsthunger.org for a participating game processor near you.
- Indicate to your processor that you wish to donate your whole game to the MSAH program -- there is no cost to you! The processor will direct the donated game to one of the Michigan Food Bank Council food banks.
- You can also choose to “Give a Pound” -- process your game at your expense and let the processor know you would like to give a pound or two of the newly processed meat to MSAH.
- You are also welcome to donate processed game directly to Gleaners Community Food Bank. Prior to processing the game, ensure that the carcass is free of signs of illness and visible decomposition or contamination. Ensure game is constantly maintained at a temperature of 41 degrees F or below.
