



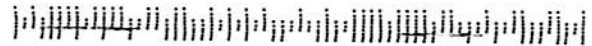
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FY 2013 Juvenile Drug Courts Training and Technical Assistance Program (CFDA No. 16.585)

Purpose: To support training and technical assistance to build capacity to develop, maintain, and enhance juvenile drug courts for substance-abusing youth.

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations (including faith-based, community, and tribal organizations), for-profit organizations, and institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$2 million.

Small, Rural School Achievement (SRSA) Program (CFDA No. 84.358A)

Purpose: To address the unique needs of rural school districts.

Eligibility: A local educational agency (LEA) (including a public charter school that is considered an

LEA under state law) is eligible for an award under the SRSA program if; the total number of students in average daily attendance at all of the schools served by the LEA is fewer than 600, or each county in which a school served by the LEA is located has a total population density of fewer than 10 persons per square mile.

Smart and Connected Health (CFDA Nos. 47.041, 47.070, 47.075, 93.172, 93.286, 93.396, 93.865, and 93.866)

Purpose: To accelerate the development and use of innovative approaches that would support the much needed transformation of healthcare from reactive and hospital-centered to preventive,

proactive, evidence-based, person-centered and focused on well-being rather than disease; and to develop next generation health care solutions and encourage existing and new research communities to focus on breakthrough ideas in a variety of areas of value to health, such as sensor technology, networking, information and machine learning technology, decision support systems, modeling of behavioral and cognitive processes, as well as system and process modeling.

Eligibility: Nonprofit, non-academic organizations; independent museums, observatories, research labs, professional societies and similar organizations in the U.S. associated with educational or research activities, universities, and colleges including community colleges.

Funding: \$20 million.

Bridging Cultures through Film: International Topics (CFDA No. 45.164)

Purpose: To support documentary films that examine international and transnational themes in the humanities to spark Americans' engagement with the broader world by exploring countries and cultures outside of the U.S.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; Native American tribal organizations; and nonprofits.

Funding: \$800,000.

Comprehensive Support Services for Families Affected by Substance Abuse and/or HIV/AIDS (CFDA No. 93.551)

Purpose: To increase well-being, improve permanency, and enhance the safety of infants and young children who have been exposed to a dangerous drug or have been exposed to HIV/AIDS and/or at risk of being placed in out-of-home care as a result of the parent(s)' substance abuse or HIV status.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; Native American tribal organizations; and nonprofits, including faith- and community-based organizations.

Funding: \$3.8 million.

FY 13 Improving the Completeness of Firearm Background Checks through Enhanced State Data Sharing (CFDA No. 16.738)

Purpose: To improve reporting of criminal history and related records used for background checks conducted through the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System for individuals seeking to purchase certain firearms.

Eligibility: State agencies with the ability and authority to implement data sharing and reporting; for-profit (commercial) and nonprofit organizations (including tribal nonprofit or for-profit organizations); and institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$1.5 million.

FY 13 Smart Probation: Reducing Prison Populations, Saving Money, and Creating Safer Communities (CFDA No. 16.812)

Purpose: To implement evidence-based supervision strategies; to improve probation success rates, which would in turn improve public safety, reduce admissions to prisons and jails, and save taxpayer dollars.

Eligibility: State, county, city, or township governments.

Funding: \$750,000.

FY 2013 Community-Based Violence Prevention FIRE Program (CFDA No. 16.541)

Purpose: To fund field-initiated studies to inform efforts to prevent and reduce youth violence (including gun violence) and violence exposure at the community level.

Eligibility: State, county, city, township, and special district governments; independent school districts; private, public, and state controlled institutions of higher education; public housing authorities/Indian housing authorities; Native American tribal organizations; nonprofits; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: \$500,000.
