

10,000 Trees Project a STEP-by-STEP Guide



- 1. Congregation contacts Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake (IPC) to express interest and obtain more information on how this project works. Please contact Kolya Braun-Greiner, M.Div. kolya@interfaithchesapeake.org or cell: 516-776-6179.
- 2. Kolya will confirm receipt of your email/phone call, and will pass your information along to the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay (the Alliance) to put your congregation in their queue for follow-up. The contact person at the Alliance is Joanna Freeman, <u>ifreeman@allianceforthebay.org</u> or 443-949-0575
- 3. Joanna at the Alliance will contact you to set up a time to talk about your vision for your land. She may schedule a site visit or may do an assessment of your space viewing Google Earth online. Either way, she will assess site qualifications such as area of land and number of possible trees to be planted.

 All questions related to type and size of trees, and planting plan should be directed to: <u>Joanna Freeman</u> at the Alliance.
- 4. Congregation gets approval from its governing body responsible for approving go-ahead for this project.
- 5. Alliance schedules a site visit to prepare Planting Plan.
- 6. IPC schedules Spiritual/ Theological & Environmental Education Workshop (can be same day as Planting Day) -- a 1hr.- 90min. program. Even though this workshop is co-produced by the Alliance and IPC, Kolya is the person who schedules this workshop and works through the logistics with the congregation.

- 7. Alliance schedules Planting Day and orders trees, deer protection and soil conditioner/mulch if necessary.
- 8. Alliance presents Planting Plan, MOU, and Maintenance Plan to Congregation Coordinator for signature.
- 9. Congregation signs Planting Plan <u>no less than 2 weeks</u> in advance of the Planting Day (so trees can be ordered in time). No changes can be made to the Planting Day within 2 weeks of the date, unless for inclement weather.
- 10. Congregation promotes both the Workshop and Planting Day:
 - a. Publicity
 - i. in congregation news/ bulletins/ website
 - ii. in local newspaper (if possible)
 - b. Draw a good-sized attendance to the Workshop
 - c. Recruit Volunteers for Planting Day
- 11. Planting Day: Alliance delivers trees and offers instruction on proper planting and maintenance procedures. Alliance serves as crew leader on Planting Day, but congregation is expected to provide the volunteers for the duration of the planting.
