LABOUR WIN 8 LOCAL COUNCIL FRIENDS SET TO TAKE OVER SEATS ACROSS LEEDS BRAMLEY BATHS

this Local elections month saw Labour increase their majority on the Council by 8, taking including seats Headingley, Rothwell, Hyde Park and Woodhouse a n d Burmantofts and Richmond Hill.

This trend was repeated nationally with Labour making gains in places like Harlow, Plymouth and Birmingham; areas we must win if we want to emerge on top in a general election.

In Leeds West, Alison Lowe was returned as the Councillor for Armley with 2,686 votes, Caroline

Gruen was elected for the first time as Councillor for Bramley with 2,343 Lucinda votes, and Yeadon was returned as Kirkstall's Councillor with 3,006 votes. Unfortunately, in Farnley & Wortley the Greens retained their seat but David Dresser fought a campaign strong reduced their majority.

Labour leader Ed Miliband told voters Labour are "back throughout the country on your side" but remained humble about the gains, noting that turn-out was extremely low and pledging appeal to those beyond the Party.

BRAMLEY POST OFFICE RE-OPENS



On Tuesday 24th April Bramley Shopping Centre Post Office was suddenly closed, without any notice

or a replacement service put in place. Rachel and Bramley Labour councillors sprang into action as soon as the news broke, with Rachel calling emergency meetings with both the Shopping Centre and the Post Office and Cllr Ted Hanley arranging for a Bramley Elderly Action bus service to transport customers to alternative branches.

On the Saturday Rachel and Ted

were out at Bramley Shopping
Centre, alongside Cllr Caroline
Gruen, Cllr Neil Taggart and local
Party members to collect petition
signatures from local residents,
calling for the Post Office to be
re-opened. By Tuesday 1st May, just
one week later, the Post Office was
re-opened with an interim owner
taking charge until a permanent
sub-postmaster is in place. A great

GOVERNMENT CLIMBDOWN ON LEGAL AID VOTE

The Government introduced a last minute amendment to the Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Bill in late April, after intense pressure from Lords, campaigners and politicians across the divide.

The Government had previously lumped victims of workplace illnesses like Mesothelioma into their reforms tackling the so-called "compensation culture".

Rachel commented, "I'm pleased that the government have finally mounted an eleventh hour climb down after pressure from Labour, peers and campaigners on these unfair plans. But it has taken too

long for the government to listen to the overwhelming opposition to this part of the Bill. To have lumped victims of workplace illnesses like Mesothelioma into a so-called 'compensation culture' was an insult. The legacy of Asbestos in Armley and cases brought by sufferers of mesothelioma show beyond doubt that they are nothing of the sort. For the victims of the IW Roberts factory in Armley and for asbestosis sufferers across the country, we need to make sure this review is done properly and I will continue to ask questions and fight for the victims of asbestos related illness."

KIRKSTALL PALE ALE IN PARLIAMENT

After several months of lobbying by Rachel, the good news came through last month that the House of Commons are to stock and sell Kirkstall Pale Ale as their "guest beer" for a week in the autumn. Rachel was delighted to hear the news and share it with brewery staff when she visited last month.

The Brewery is situated by the Leeds, Liverpool canal and is in the shadow of the original Kirkstall Brewery.

Kirkstall has a brewing heritage stretching back to the 12th century.



Launched last summer by Steve Holt, who has a wealth of experience in the beer industry, the new Kirkstall Brewery revives the long tradition of brewing in the area.
