She also spoke about the work that the Sophie Lancaster Foundation now do, going into schools and teaching children not to judge each other by the way they dress. Equalities Conferences I was really pleased to attend the Young Labour Black Asian Minority Ethnic (BAME) conference in early November and the Young Labour Disabled Members Conference in late November. The Young Labour BAME event had over 50 young members attend, and it was fantastic to see more women in attendance than men. It was also good to attend the Disabled Members conference where members got the chance to speak to Shadow Disability Minister Kate Green MP and the Chair of the Work and Pensions Select Committee Dame Anne Begg MP. Well done to Simon Evans and Furgan Naeem who organised the two conferences and thanks to Dean Carlin for all his work preparing for them.

I was invited to speak at the Ealing Borough Conference where members and council candidates where meetings to discuss ideas for their manifesto for London local elections in 2014.
