### **NEC** meeting, 4 February

The NEC met on 4 February to discuss Ray Collins' report on party reforms. I welcomed in particular the proposal to reach out to more people in our communities through the registered supporters network and the proposed changes to the selections process, which I believe would enable more people from a wider variety of backgrounds to stand to be candidates. I also ensured that our young members, supporters and trade unionists would be able to have a vote in our leadership contest and primaries, even if they weren't old enough to be on the electoral registers, as many of our members are younger than 16. With a few changes, we agreed that the document should be sent to the special conference on 1 March for delegates to vote on.

### 3 Seats Challenge, 8 February

We did our second 3 Seats Challenge, this month campaigning in Finchley and Golders Green, Hendon and Harrow East. An amazing 61 activists got involved, giving a combined total of 157 doorstep hours in one day and speaking to lots of voters!
