Background briefing

This motion and the accompanying policy paper 108, *A Balanced Working Life*, develop policy on a range of issues relevant to low and middle income households including on flexible working, childcare and early years education, and wellbeing at work. It creates new policy on the living wage.

Existing party policy on the provision of childcare and flexible working is set out in conference motion *Early Years* (2012), the 2010 General Election Manifesto *Change That Works For You* and policy paper 88, *The Best Start for Children*. Existing policy on wellbeing at work is set out in policy paper 102, *A New Purpose for Politics: Quality of Life* (2011).

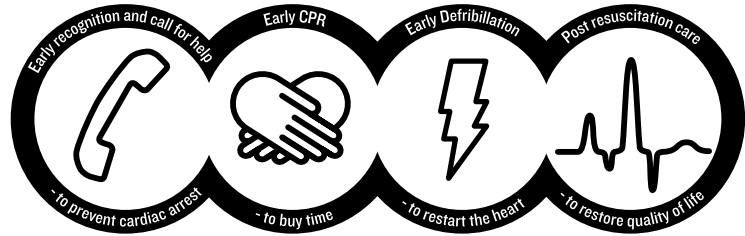
