

NC Women United Membership Renewal Information

NCWU works to achieve full political, social, and economic equality for women across this state. Working with our member organizations, we use a unique mix of grassroots activism, community organizing, legislative advocacy, and engagement in the political process to accomplish our goals. Our major events include:

- ★ Sponsorship of Women's Agenda Assemblies (WAA) prior to the start of the NC General Assembly long session (takes place every "odd" year);
- ★ Women's Advocacy Day scheduled at the legislature each year
- ★ Release of a report card on the legislative session, typically at end of the long session

NCWU is an all-volunteer organization, supported by organizations' membership dues and contributions from individuals around the state. Once you've joined and named a primary representative to be your liaison with NCWU, the benefits of membership include:

- ★ The opportunity to submit topics and bills for the Women's Draft Agenda (used at WAAs) and the Women's Agenda (presented at Advocacy Day).
- ★ Permission to post your event announcements, job openings, and other organizational information to members@ncwu.org, reaching over 100 representatives of our member organizations who may forward the post to their thousands of stakeholders.
- ★ Recognition as a member organization on http://www.ncwu.org as well as on all materials associated with projects such as Advocacy Day and the Legislative Report Card
- ★ The opportunity to request that the coalition endorse a specific issue, and a vote on any such issues brought to the coalition.
- ★ A vote at the annual meeting on the officers and governance committee members who will guide the organization and set its bylaws and policies.
- ★ Inclusion of your organization's activities and accomplishments in the NCWU enewsletter, which is sent to our member listserv as well as placed on the NCWU website
- ★ Be a part of NCWU's social media presence see what other NCWU members are doing, and make sure your organization's information is also being shared here.
- * Representation in community and statewide coalitions that NCWU is part of.
- ★ Connecting your organization's issues and advocacy with others' in a way that strengthens the advocacy of all of our groups and shows how our issues intersect.
- ★ NCWU maintains a membership with the NC Center for Nonprofits; through this membership, NCWU members can access benefits and discounts to the Center's products and services.

NCWU is a 501(c)3 organization, and contributions from individuals are tax deductible as charitable contributions. Donors, as well as staff members and volunteers with member organizations may subscribe to members@ncwu.org, and are welcome to volunteer with NCWU.

The NCWU dues schedule is as follows:

Organization Annual Budget under \$3500	\$35 per year
Organization Annual Budget \$3500 -\$100,000	\$75 per year
Organization Annual Budget \$100,000-\$500,000	\$150 per year
Organization Annual Budget over \$500,000	\$250 per year

The dues year is the calendar year. <u>Dues for renewing members are payable by February 20</u>. New members may join at any time. Dues received after October 1 will confer membership through the next calendar year. You can either mail your renewal dues or renew on-line (addresses for both options are found at the bottom of the membership form).
