Resolutions of the Members of the Brookland Manor/Brentwood Village Residents Association Adopted February 8, 2017

Background

The Brookland Manor/Brentwood Village Residents Association (the "Association") has been actively engaged in the process surrounding the proposed redevelopment of their community. The Association participated as a party opponent in the First Stage PUD process. The Association is a registered Non-Profit Corporation in the District of Columbia and is in good standing. Resolutions

The Members of the Association adopt the following resolutions:

- 1) The Association Re-affirms its long standing demands that the proposed redevelopment of Brookland Manor be inclusive and equitable. Specifically the Association demands:
 - a. The preservation of all 535 units of affordable housing at the same bedroom sizes and current subsidy levels that currently exists on the property;
 - b. That Brookland Manor residents remain on the property during the process of redevelopment and are not displaced;
 - c. That Brookland Manor residents be able to access employment opportunities through the rebuilding of their own community, which they have a fundamental right to be a part of.
- 2) The Association will participate in the February 23rd zoning hearing as a party opponent. This means that the Association will oppose Mid-City's current redevelopment plans and instead fight for the above stated demands.
- 3) The President of the Association, Minnie Elliott, is authorized to act on the Associations behalf and bind the entity at the hearing.
