‘Community Exchange System’ to be open-sourced 2014

Largest community exchange network in the world to be upgraded.

Brisbane, 20th December 2013: A new community software infrastructure is under development which helps communities share resources individually and collectively.

Community Exchange System (CES), a free software service already connecting hundreds of communities worldwide, is to be completely modernised, decentralised, and released open source.

The platform allows exchange groups, like LETS, Timebanks and business barter systems to exchange between one another. Several separate deployments of the platform are planned.

A group of complementary currency experts involved in CES, Community Forge, Jnana and others is managing the software development and its first three deployments.

Funds are now being sought for the next phase, which is to network other platforms into a global grid and produce a free, open source mobile phone application with a public API.

“This will be a global sharing infrastructure; we hope this software and the protocols we are publishing will draw in local networks from around the world.”
