Smithsonian All Access invites Washington, DC metro area teens (**ages 14-22**) with **cognitive disabilities**, to participate in a one-week digital arts summer camp at the Smithsonian Institution to explore their **identities**: their interests, choices & values. Teens are supported by staff and peer volunteers as they explore museums to learn about how people are represented through art and ideas. At **ARTLAB+**, teens create a portfolio of **self-portraits**—both traditional (drawing mediums and digital photography) and non-traditional/ abstract (sound and collage).
