### How to Guide

Hosting your own Voter Registration Drive is easy! Just follow our simple guide and have fun!

#### **1) Pick your Place**

- Make sure you choose your location wisely; pick somewhere with high traffic or somewhere where people tend to congregate, this could be your Student Union building, by the lunch hall or in your break room at work.

#### **2) Bide your Time**

- Busy places contain busy people – or people who think they're busy at least! Choose a time when people are most likely to be hanging about or in less of a rush – lunch time works or after lectures.

#### **3) Find your Team**

- Get as many people involved as possible and you'll increase the fun and the numbers you get registered! Look to other groups for support – whether it's your book group, your sports team, or even your workplace union – bring as many people on board as you can!

#### **4) Print your Posters**
