The Allstate Foundation Awards \$75,000 to Sandy Hook Promise
Student-Led Groups Across the Carolinas Receive Aid for Anti-Violence Efforts

Raleigh, NC – September 29, 2017 – Leading gun violence prevention organization Sandy Hook Promise (SHP) is receiving a \$75,000 grant from the Allstate Foundation for their Students Against Violence Everywhere (SAVE) Promise Clubs and their *Know The Signs* violence prevention program delivery to schools across the Carolinas. SHP's *Know The Signs* violence prevention programs educate youth and adults on mental health and wellness, identification of at-risk behaviors and how to take action and get help before a situation escalates. SHP was founded by several family members who lost loved ones in the tragic shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School on December 14, 2012.

As part of the Allstate Foundation grant, 20 selected SAVE Promise Clubs will receive mini grant funds, educational materials, training for school and community activities, ongoing support and technical assistance for their youth violence prevention efforts, and opportunities to partner with local Allstate agents to further the cause. Through these efforts, thousands of students across the Carolinas will be educated and directly engaged in SAVE Promise Club activities.

The Allstate Foundation and Sandy Hook Promise will kick off their partnership with a *Know The Signs* Workshop. The October 3rd workshop in Raleigh, NC will host participating Allstate grant club advisors and SAVE Promise Clubs student leadership for a day of training in SHP's *Know The Signs* programs. The training will empower them to return to their schools and implement effective violence prevention solutions. Attendees will hear from Allstate representatives as well as Sandy Hook Promise representatives.

SAVE Promise Clubs at participating schools are led by students for students, which gives members the opportunity to lead the planning and execution of youth safety campaigns for their peers. The clubs plan activities around Sandy Hook Promise’s *Know The Signs* violence prevention programs and other activities aimed at creating a safer school and community environment. Club initiatives will also promote various national observances and events throughout the year, including SHP’s *Say Something Week* (October 16-20), *Start With Hello Week* in February, National Youth Violence Prevention Week in March, and the National SAVE Promise Club Youth Summit in April.

“We are thrilled to receive this award from the Allstate Foundation. With their support, we are able to facilitate our *Know The Signs* violence prevention programs through our SAVE Promise Clubs, and empower students to help reach our goals of preventing school shootings, reduce bullying, and making our communities more inclusive and safe for everyone,” said Nicole Hockley, Managing Director of Sandy Hook Promise, and mother of 6-year old Dylan who was killed in the Sandy Hook School tragedy.
