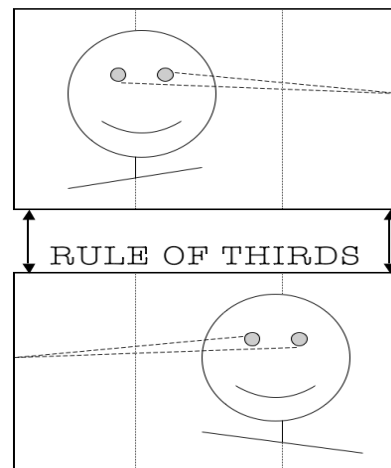
19th March 2014 is budget day and a mass rally at Downing Street for a budget day protest. If you have access to a video camera/ iphone please get out onto the streets and ask local people one question: **"What would you like to say to Osborne on budget day?"** Send us the footage and we will edit it into a film with a powerful message to Osborne, we don't want his austerity budget – this is what we **do** want.

Compose your shots

When filming use the 'rule of thirds', position the person slightly off centre and give them 'looking room'...



- Interviews look better if the person is slightly off centre and there is more space on the screen in the direction they are looking. This works best if you are working with someone else who is asking the questions.



Sound is important

- The camera mic won't filter out the sounds around you so find somewhere quiet to interview if it is too noisy...

Establishing shots

Remember, don't zoom in and out or move the camera about too much. Take close ups, long shots, etc. Hold for more



- Take a variety shots of your local area, street signs, local high streets, landmarks and other significant images.
