As a Certified B Corporation, TuShare voluntarily meets a higher standard of transparency, accountability, and performance, harnessing the power of business to solve social and environmental problems in communities and across the nation. The 'benefit corporation' movement in the United States began in order to address the importance of environmental and social issues that, if handled ethically, have an impact on the bottom line. There are currently 1000 Certified B Corporations from more than 60 industries in 32 countries including global brands, outdoor clothing company Patagonia, Ben & Jerry's ice cream and online marketplace Etsy. In Australia 25 companies are certified as B Corps including investment firm Small Giants, snack range Whole Kids and sustainability consultants Net Balance.

"Becoming a Certified B Corporation reinforces TuShare's mission to be Australia's largest sharing platform which helps products find their next owners, avoiding waste and landfill in the process, said TuShare Founder and CEO James Bradfield Moody. "We believe that business can work towards a common goal positively contributing to society and our planet."
