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## **MEDICAL CERTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR ALL CDL DRIVERS LICENSED IN DELAWARE**

### **Attention All Delaware CDL License Holders**

**January 30, 2014 is the deadline for Delaware CDL license holders to self-certify** their driving status under medical certification guidelines established by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration. All Delaware drivers should have already received notice of these new medical certification requirements in the mail. This On The Move is a reminder.

Drivers who have not provided the required copy of their medical certificate by the January 30, 2014 deadline will have their **licenses downgraded to non-commercial**, Class D privileges only and **their jobs will be at risk**.

At the present time, medical certification can be obtained from any licensed medical professional as listed on the certificate. Starting May 21, 2014, Delaware CDL holders will have to obtain the examination from a licensed medical professional who is certified by the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners. However, if you get certified prior to May 21, 2014, as required, you will be grandfathered in and will not need a new medical certificate issued until your current certification expires.

**The required Medical Examiner Certificate paperwork can be obtained at the web address [http://www.dmv.de.gov/forms/forms\\_manuals.shtml](http://www.dmv.de.gov/forms/forms_manuals.shtml). Look for the form entitled "Fed Medical Certification (DOT Physical) Exam Form." Print the form and take it to your appointment with your medical examiner.** The form must be completed in its entirety by the medical examiner at the time of your appointment.

Once you have the medical certification form completed you must fill out the Self-Certification Affidavit, which can also be obtained at the same web site, and fax to **(302)-739-2602, Attn: CDL Department**, or **hand deliver** both forms to **(it's too late to mail)** the closest branch of the Delaware Division of Motor Vehicles in New Castle, Dover, or Georgetown Delaware. At this point, **hand delivery is the best and safest way to submit your paperwork to the Delaware DMV.**
