Proposal

The proposal is for a 10-storey, 45 metre high (including the mechanical penthouse), mixed use building with 35 residential units and 771 square metres of retail-commercial space. The proposal includes 57 parking spaces in a 4-level underground parking garage. There is no loading space proposed. The existing detached and semi-detached mixed-use buildings on the site will be demolished. The overall density is 6.5 FSI.

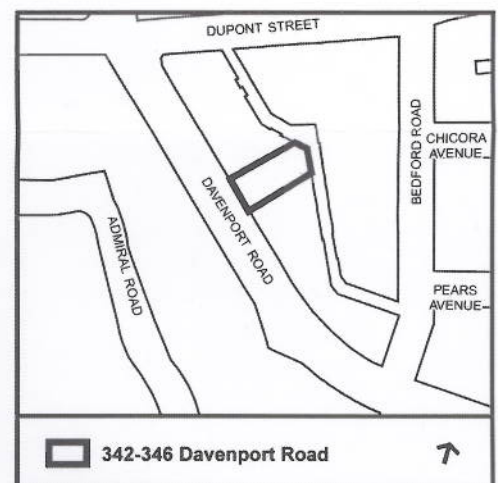
