



Bill Introduced to Encourage Renewable Energy Development

Rep. Jay Inslee (D-WA) recently introduced an important piece of federal legislation that could spur an unprecedented amount of new renewable energy development in the United States. Titled the "Renewable Energy Jobs and Security Act" (H.R. 6401), it brings the successful feed in tariff system (more commonly called renewable energy payments) that has allowed Germany and other European countries to become leaders in renewable energy development over the past few years. A German report states that in 2006 alone, renewable energy payments were responsible for the creation of 134,000 jobs and a net positive economic impact of \$23.5 million.

The act as submitted to the United States Congress has three main components:

1. A guarantee to interconnect renewable energy projects under 20MW to the grid with uniform standards.
2. A mandatory power purchase agreement (PPA) through long-term contracts with fixed tariffs.
3. The creation of Renewcorps, a rate-recovery program, through a regional cost-sharing and systems benefit charge to end-users.

This act addresses some of the more important barriers that exist in developing renewable energy projects such as the lengthy interconnection queue and the uncertainty that comes with negotiating PPAs.

Several states, such as Michigan, California and Minnesota have introduced similar bills in their respective state legislatures.

[Women of Wind Energy \(WoWE\)](#) is the little organization that could. Founded around a luncheon table in 2005 and housed at Windustry, this group now has a nationwide reach.

number of programs:

- **Local chapters.** There now are 11 chapters across the country where women gather on a regular basis to network and socialize: Boston, Boulder/Denver, Canada, Chicago, Minneapolis/Saint Paul, San Francisco, Seattle, Texas and Vermont.
- **Online mentoring program.** Introduced this summer, this program allows women from around the county to be involved as either a mentor or mentee.
- **Conference sponsorships for female students.** Each year, through the Rudd Mayer Memorial Sponsorship program, WoWE sends several college students or recent graduates to the annual American Wind Energy Association conference.
