The election is November 8th but ballots will be mailed October 21st. The deadline for voter registration, address change and other updates is October 10th (except in person) so the window is shrinking fast.

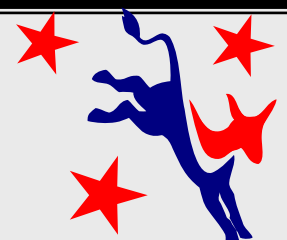

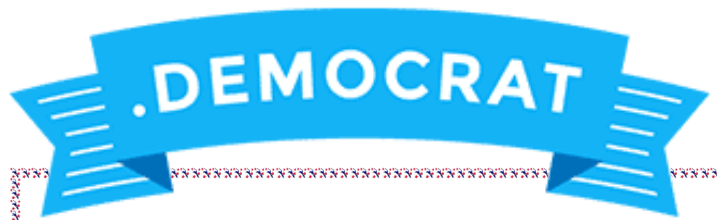

Resolution to Recommend that the City of Seattle Reduce on the Funding and Utilize the Racial Equity Toolkit on the \$149 Million North Seattle Police Precinct

Whereas the North Seattle Police Precinct has a widespread impact; and

Whereas the North Precinct Advisory Council group's mission statement, according to its by-laws, "is to establish a mechanism by which the community may communicate its concerns to the Police Department and City Government, and may do its part in dealing with those concerns"; and

Whereas the North Precinct Advisory Council also has been the only citizen group to get regular updates on the new station for the past four years; and

Whereas The Racial Equity Toolkit lays out a process and a set of questions to guide the development, implementation and evaluation of policies, initiatives, programs, and budget issues to address the impacts on racial equity; and

Whereas the Racial Equity Toolkit requires the application early for alignment with departmental racial equity goals and desired outcomes; and

Whereas the Racial Equity Tool Kit was not utilized before proposing the North Precinct Bunker funding; and

Whereas the North Precinct Advisory Council has failed to do so; and

Whereas the North Precinct Advisory Council has a lack of diversity; and

Whereas there were no representatives of people of color at the North Precinct Advisory Council; now

Therefore be it resolved that the 46th District Democrats recommend that the City of Seattle Council reduce the funding proposal for the \$149 for the North Seattle Precinct; and

Therefore be it resolved that the 46th District Democrats recommend that the City of Seattle Council utilize the Racial Equity Toolkit prior to funding.

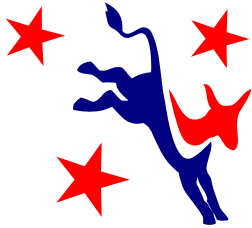
