# Congressional Scorecard





Members of Congress are heading back to their home districts for the August recess, and the 2004 campaigns are in high gear.

**Now is the time to contact your Senators and Representative to express your views about key issues affecting Arab Americans! Here's how:**

## Personal Visits

Personal visits, either in your home state/district or in Washington, are the most effective means of communicating with your congressional members. Here are a few hints:

- ◆ Schedule a meeting with your Congressman for three to five local Arab American community leaders. Members of Congress have very busy schedules even while in recess, and going in a small group of prominent local leaders rather than individually both demonstrates the seriousness of your meeting request and maximizes the time the Congress member has available. Call the member's office or send a letter (see our sample letter on the next page) and outline what issues you would like to discuss and who will be attending the meeting.
- ◆ Whether you're requesting a meeting in Washington DC or in a field office, you may be scheduled to meet with a Congressional staff member. Staffers have considerable influence on their bosses, who rely on them for information and briefings, and also have a strong background in and understanding of the issues. Treat a meeting with a staff member as you would a meeting with your member of Congress.
- ◆ Email, fax, or mail an issues brief or a short agenda of what you'd like to cover during your visit. This lets your members of Congress know what concerns you have, gives them or their staff time to do any necessary research, and also lets them know that you respect their schedules and plan to keep the meeting brief.
- ◆ Be prompt. Members are extremely busy, and if you are even a few minutes late, your meeting may have to be canceled.
- ◆ Mention specific issues, and specific legislation if possible. Ask your representative to consider voting a particular way or cosponsoring a bill.
- ◆ Use facts; don't rely on an emotional argument. Do your research on the issues by contacting AAI and other organizations for background, and read the Action Alerts, Must-Read News, AAI position statements, and other relevant resources on our website for information before your visit.
- ◆ If you have concerns or issues on a local level, don't

hesitate to ask for their help. Your representatives may, for example, be willing to facilitate a meeting between local law enforcement and the Arab American community to discuss hate crimes if their schedule permits. Everyone benefits from this type of cooperation.

- ◆ Send a note or email of thanks after your visit. Emphasize that you appreciate your representatives taking time to listen to your views and concerns, and that you look forward to continuing cooperation between the member of Congress and the Arab American community in their district. Include a brief summary of the issues discussed and your views.

**Even if you aren't meeting your members of Congress during this recess, you CAN make your concerns heard:**

- ◆ Members of Congress pay attention to the local press. Write letters to the editor or op-ed pieces, and engage with the local media, encouraging them to raise issues with your representatives.
- ◆ Lay the groundwork now for action in the future: get to know your members of Congress and the candidates for election in your area. Volunteer to distribute leaflets or make phone calls, put up a yard sign, or make a donation to the campaigns of the candidates you support. You'll be making your voice heard through your actions and your vote. And, should those candidates be elected, you can preface a request for a meeting with a mention of your support of their campaign.
- ◆ Let AAI know what your concerns are. We work throughout the campaign and election cycle to raise our community's issues with the candidates, and is the Arab American voice in Washington. Visit our website, [www.aaiusa.org](http://www.aaiusa.org), for more information on our efforts and issues.

## Phone Calls

Phone calls are one of the most common, and easiest, means of communicating with your member's office. Keep in mind:

- Ask to speak to the relevant legislative assistant or, in the case of district offices, caseworker.
- Always be polite when expressing your views.
- Follow up with a letter stating your concerns.

## Letters

If you'd like to write a personalized letter, keep the following tips in mind:

- Keep the letter concise, polite, and to the point
- Note the name and number of a particular piece of legislation in the letter
- Follow up with a phone call a week or two after sending your letter

## Online

Visit the AAI website ([www.aaiusa.org](http://www.aaiusa.org)), where you'll find frequently updated information on issues of interest to the Arab American community.

You can contact your Senators and Representative on the Action Alerts portion of our website: just select the issue you're concerned about and enter your zip code to get started.

You'll be prompted to select which of your representatives you'd like to write to and to fill out your name and contact information. We include sample letters and issue briefs to assist you. It's a quick, easy, and effective way to get your message across.

You can also visit your senators' or representative's websites (find them at [www.house.gov](http://www.house.gov) or [www.senate.gov](http://www.senate.gov)) and send them an email.

When composing your email, follow the guidelines above for writing letters.

The Arab American Institute has compiled this Scorecard for the 108th Congress to inform our community of their members' voting records. The Scorecard is based on Congressional actions on a number of issues, outlined below.

While not comprehensive, and while no member of Congress can be judged fairly by any single action, this guide provides a general profile of Congressional behavior that we hope will help Arab Americans better understand actions taken on these key issues.



**1. Iraq:** House Joint Resolution 114, passed by the Senate in October 2002, authorized the use of force against Iraq. Although this vote occurred during the 107th Congress, it is included in the 108th Scorecard because of its importance to the Arab American community. Those who voted in favor of the resolution receive a (-) and those who voted against receive a (+).

**2. Syria:** The Syria Accountability Act was first introduced during the 107th Congress. In 2003, Sen. Boxer (D-CA) and Sen. Santorum (R-PA) introduced an even more far-reaching resolution, S. 982. This bill outlines 36 "findings" regarding Syrian wrongdoings, including support for terrorism, occupation of Lebanon, acquisition of WMD, and violations of the Iraqi sanctions regime. The bill calls for the imposition of various sanctions (including severing diplomatic ties) unless the president determines it has met certain criteria. Co-sponsors receive a (-).

**3. Immigration Reform:** One of the more positive initiatives in the 108th Congress is S. 922, introduced by Sen. Reid (D-NV). This is a "bill to change the requirements for naturalization through service in the Armed Forces of the United States... (and)... to extend posthumous benefits to surviving spouses, children, and parents." Co-sponsors receive a (+).

**4. Hate Crimes:** The Senate passed S. RES.133, which condemns bigotry and violence against Arab Americans, Muslim Americans, South Asian Americans and Sikh Americans. The bill calls for the prevention, investigation and prosecution of hate crimes. The resolution was co-sponsored by 15 Senators and passed by unanimous consent. Senators who co-sponsored it receive a (+).

**5. Civil Liberties:** The Senate passed S. 113 by a 90-4 vote. This bill expanded government surveillance powers by amending "the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to cover individuals, other than United States persons, who engage in international terrorism without affiliation with an international terrorist group." Those voting against the bill, or not voting, receive a (+), and those voting for the bill receive a (-).

**6. Road Map:** The day the Bush Administration officially released the Road Map, members of the Senate sent a letter to the President. Although the Senate letter is more nuanced than the House version (discussed below), the letter focuses exclusively on Palestinian obligations. This one-sided letter was an unhelpful attempt to tie the President's hands in his efforts to restart the peace process. Senators received a (+) for not signing the letter and a (-) for signing the letter.

**7. Special Category:** Senators receive a (+) or (-) for special initiatives in support of or in opposition to Arab American concerns. These include immigration, civil liberties, and U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East:

- ♦ (+) Senators who sent a letter on June 23, 2003 to Attorney General Ashcroft calling for an end to secret detentions

- ♦ (+) Sen. Sununu for sponsoring the CARE and Save the Children Hearing on May 7, 2003, "Middle East Conflicts: The Impact on Children"

- ♦ (+) Sen. Sarbanes for his January 2003 letter in support of aid to Lebanon

- ♦ (+) Sen. Warner for his March 2003 letter to Bush suggesting NATO provide peacekeepers in support of the Road Map

- ♦ (+) Senators co-sponsoring S. 188, "A bill to impose a moratorium on the implementation of datamining under the Total Information Awareness program of the Department of Defense and any similar program of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes"

- ♦ (+) Senators co-sponsoring S. 436, "To amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to improve the administration and oversight of foreign intelligence surveillance, and for other purposes"

- ♦ (+) Senators who proposed the Kyl-Kennedy-Feinstein-McCain-Feingold Amendment to the Omnibus Appropriations Bill. This amendment, which cut funding for the National Security Entry-Exit Program (NSEERS, also called "Special Registration") and required Attorney General Ashcroft to report to Congress regarding the program, did not make it into the final version of the bill.

- ♦ (+) Sen. Durbin for his May 2003 letter to Secretary Ridge regarding the impact of the newly instated USVISIT program on civil liberties

- ♦ (-) Senators co-sponsoring S.CON.RES 32, which provides a sense of Congress "to assure the safety of American citizens, the holy sites currently under the sovereignty of the State of Israel should remain under Israeli protection, and that all holy sites in the region remain open to visitors of all faiths."

- ♦ (+) Senators Kennedy, Dodd, Harkin, Warner, and Jeffords for speaking against the nomination of Daniel Pipes to the board of the United States Institute of Peace (USIP) during the July 23, 2003 executive session of the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee. Senator Ensign receives a (-) for speaking in favor of the nomination.

**1. Iraq:** The House passed H.J. RES. 114 in October 2002 to authorize the use of force against Iraq. Although this vote occurred during the 107th Congress, it is included here given its importance to the Arab American community. Those who voted in favor of the resolution receive a (-) and those who voted against receive a (+).

**2. Syria:** The House version of the Syrian Accountability Act (H.R. 1828) was introduced by Rep. Engell (D-NY) and Rep. Ros-Leitinen (R-FL) on April 12, 2003. This is an expanded version of the resolution first introduced during the 107th Congress. Co-sponsors receive a (-).

**3. Immigration Reform:** Among the more positive initiatives in the 108th Congress are:

- ♦ H.R. 47, "To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to restore fairness to immigration law, and for other purposes." This resolution was introduced by Rep. Conyers (D-MI) on January 7, 2003. Co-sponsors receive a (+).

- ♦ H.R. 1275, "To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to change the requirements for naturalization to citizenship through service in the Armed Forces of the United States." This resolution was introduced by Rep. Frost (D-TX) on March 13, 2003. Co-sponsors receive a (+).

- ♦ H.R. 1814: This resolution is the House version of S. 922 (discussed above), which was introduced by Rep. Solis (D-CA) on April 11, 2003. Co-sponsors receive a (+).

- ♦ H.R. 2585, "To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit certain long-term permanent resident aliens to seek cancellation of removal under such Act, and for other purposes." This resolution was introduced by Rep. Frank (D-MA) on June 24, 2003. Co-sponsors receive a (+).

**4. Hate Crimes:** On May 14, 2003, Rep. Issa (R-CA) and Rep. Kaptur (D-OH) introduced H. RES. 234, the House version of the Senate anti-hate crimes resolution. The House version has not yet come up for a vote. Members receive a (+) for co-sponsorship.

**5. Unbalanced Resolutions:**

- ♦ H. RES. 61, "Commending the people of Israel for conducting free and fair elections, reaffirming the friendship between the Governments and peoples of the United States and Israel, and for other purposes." Despite the title, this resolution goes far beyond commending Israel on its recent elections. It also condemns the Palestinian leadership and calls for their removal. This one-sided resolution was unhelpful to U.S. efforts to be a balanced and honest broker in the peace process. Those who voted in favor of the resolution receive a (-), and those who voted against it, abstained, or were not present receive a (+).

- ♦ H.R. 294, "Condemning the terrorism inflicted on Israel since the Aqaba Summit and expressing solidarity with the Israeli people in their fight against terrorism." This one-sided resolution voices unequivocal support for Israel and fails to mention Palestinian suffering or rights. Those who voted in favor of the resolution receive a (-); those who voted against it, abstained, were not present, or made a strong floor statement receive a (+).

In those cases where a member received a (+) for his or her vote on H.R. 294 but a (-) for his or her vote on H.R. 61, the member got a (+) overall because of H.R. 294's significance.

**6. Road Map:** The day the Bush Administration officially released the Road Map, 285 members of the House sent a letter to President Bush which focused exclusively on Palestinian obligations. This letter received praise from the

controversial Israeli Minister of Tourism, Benny Elon. In his letter to Rep. Lantos (D-CA), who circulated the House letter, Elon stated "I, like you, feel that the 'Road Map' in its present form and concept is not viable and even dangerous to the state of Israel, the only democracy in the Middle East."

However, on May 20, 2003, Rep. Capps (D-CA), Rep. Houghton (R-NY), Rep. Issa (R-CA), and Rep. Price (D-NC) sent a letter to the President commending him for his peace efforts. In contrast to the aforementioned letter, the May 20 letter mentions both Israeli and Palestinian obligations under the Road Map. Members who signed this letter receive a (+). Those members who signed both letters receive a (+/-).

**7. US Aid to Lebanon:** On June 30, 2003 ten Congressmen sent a letter to Chairman Kolbe and Ranking Member Lowey encouraging the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Foreign Operations to maintain the current level of aid to Lebanon (\$35 million). The letter also encouraged the subcommittee to earmark \$4 million in aid for American educational institutions in Lebanon. All ten signatories receive a (+). Although not on the June letter, Rep. Issa also receives a (+) for sending a similar letter on April 15, 2003 whose three other signatories were also on the June letter.

**8. Special Category:** Members receive a (+) or (-) for special initiatives in support of or in opposition to Arab American concerns. These include immigration, civil liberties, and US foreign policy in the Middle East:

- ♦ (+) Rep. Jackson-Lee for re-introducing a private relief bill (H.R.231) that sought to prevent the deportation of the Kesbah family, a Palestinian refugee family residing in Texas. Despite her efforts, the family was deported to Jordan in March 2003.

- ♦ (+) Rep. Holt for introducing a private relief bill (H.R.867) providing immigration relief for the Hasan family, whose father was killed on September 15, 2001 in a hate crime.

- ♦ (+) Rep. Baird for introducing H.CON.RES. 111, "Expressing sympathy for the loss of Rachel Corrie in the Palestinian village of Rafah in the Gaza Strip on March 16, 2003." The 42 current co-sponsors of the resolution also receive a +.

- ♦ (+) Rep. Shays for sponsoring a CARE and Save the Children briefing on May 7, 2003, "Middle East Conflicts: The Impact on Children."

- ♦ (-) Rep. Weiner and Rep. Carson for co-sponsorship of H.R. 1823, "To prohibit United States assistance for the Palestinian Authority and for programs, projects, and activities in the West Bank and Gaza."

- ♦ (-) Rep. Lantos for introducing H.CON.RES 133, "Expressing the concern of Congress over Russian and Syrian actions in support of Iraq."

- ♦ (-) Rep. Chris Smith for his anti-UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency, the organization which provides assistance to Palestinian refugees living in the Middle East) amendment to the State Department Authorization Bill, H.R. 1950

- ♦ (-) Rep. Reynolds for introducing H.R. 167, "To take certain steps toward recognition by the United States of Jerusalem as the capital of Israel." All 37 co-sponsors of the resolution also receive a (-).

- ♦ (-) Rep. Lantos, Rep. Ros-Leitinen, and Rep. Sherman for their January 2003 letter to Mexican President Fox regarding that country's votes on UN resolutions

- ♦ (-) Rep. Ackerman, Rep. Ros-Leitinen, Rep. Lantos for June 2003 letter to President Bush titled "REFORM + TERROR = PEACE?" This letter condemns European and Arab leaders for maintaining ties to Arafat.
