OUTSaskatoon's Pride Home houses 2SLGBTQ youth and needs an enthusiastic support worker to model and positive and healthy relationship and life skills.

About the Position

Hours: 21 Hours per week

Salary: \$17/hr

Schedule: Evenings and weekends

Benefits: Part-time employee benefits after three months

We are looking for a community-minded, compassionate, and eager individual to fill our position of Pride Home Support Worker. The Pride Home Support Worker provides peer-support and helps to create and maintain independent and healthy lifestyles for youth at Pride Home, OUTSaskatoon's 2SLGBTQ Youth Home.

Pride Home is a long term care housing option for 2SLGBTQ youth ages 16-21 and follows an independent supportive model of care. Pride Home is a holistic and trauma informed-care work and living environment that practices harm reduction. The Pride Home Support worker will work within the group home to support youth during the evening and over the weekend.

OUTSaskatoon is dedicated to building an organization that reflects the diversity of all we serve. This includes prioritizing applicants that are diverse in gender identity, sexuality, culture, and race. Please use your cover letter to tell us about yourself and your interest in working with OUTSaskatoon. **Preferential consideration will be given to First Nations, Metis, and Two Spirit applicants. We rely on section 48 of The Saskatchewan Human Rights Code for this measure.**

Tasks:

1. Provides peer support services and referrals to youth living in Pride Home.
2. Provides support to Pride Home Coordinator and assists with coordinating programming, providing support and supervision to youth living in-home, and assisting with appointments.
3. Works with youth to build life and social skills through motivational interviewing and harm-reduction models.
4. Ensures that the basic needs of youth are met (including food, clothing, and medical needs) through a strengths-based model (i.e. working with youth to build skills and capacity to meet their own needs).
5. Works to provide programs that are culturally appropriate and inclusive, as per youth living in the home.
6. Works with the Pride Home Coordinator to maintain the cleanliness and upkeep of Pride Home through a collaborative model and as per the guidelines of Pride Home.
7. Work with the Pride Home Coordinator on monthly case management for youth.
8. Completes monthly statistical record-keeping and reporting.
9. Additional duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

Residential support worker certificate, Youth Care worker certificate, Therapeutic Recreation Certificate or an equivalent certificate. One-two years of experience working in a human services field in a youth care worker/support services/peer support capacity. Knowledge of queer issues or relevant lived experience is required. A valid driver's license, access to a vehicle, and proficiency in software applications such as MS Word, Excel, online case management software are valuable. Equivalent combinations of education and experience may be considered.

Working Conditions: The incumbent works in a group home environment. Shift and weekend work is required. Lifts and carries heavy items such as boxes of materials, groceries, and supplies. Mostly drives locally, occasionally travels within the province.

This is a part-time position at 21 hours per week.
