The Queensland State Co-ordinator is responsible to maintain ACL's political effectiveness in Queensland. This will be achieved by overseeing the growth and development of ACL's grassroots activist movement, complemented with strategic lobbying and some media tactics.

As an increasingly capable grassroots campaigner, ACL's volunteers are central to what we do. The objective is to drive ACL's key political objectives through nimble, strategic, mass action by organised and trained volunteers.

You will be a natural people person with high emotional intelligence, a consummate organiser, and a leader. As someone who is comfortable maintaining and proactively developing a large number of relationships, you will be adept at working with both politicians and grassroots volunteers.

You will also be a capable spokesperson.

The State Co-ordinator reports to the National Field Co-ordinator and works closely with the Chief Political Officer

Location: Brisbane metropolitan area – able to work from home.

Responsibilities

- Volunteer recruitment, engagement, training, mobilisation, and leadership.
- Direct the work program of local coordinators.
- Help identify strategic opportunities to execute nimble, effective campaigns for both specific issues and during elections.
- Lead specific campaign activities, including doorknocking, leafleting, event management, phone calling, pre-polling, etc.
- Establish relevant lobbying relationships with state politicians.
- Act as a Queensland spokesperson when necessary.
- Ability to talk to media is advantageous but not essential.

- Energise the growth and success of ACL's activities in Queensland; and
- Assist if required with the management of National Days of Action.

Key Accountabilities

- Demonstrate measurable impacts through ACL campaigns.
- Achieve strategic, targeted grassroots volunteer growth in the Queensland.
- Train all willing and able volunteers and appoint an active local coordinator in every federal electorate in Queensland.
- Establish and maintain key political relationships for political advocacy and to inform campaign design, strategy, and tactics.
- Maintain ACL stakeholder engagement in Queensland.
- Maintain ACL's Christian ethos and motto of "truth made public" in all aspects of political operations.

Selection Criteria

- Evidence of exemplary faith and Christian character.
- Commitment to ACL's vision.
- Very strong interpersonal skills.
- Track record of diverse relationship building.
- Teaching or training experience is an asset.
- Ability to use and engage with technology.
- Good public speaking skills.
- Proven leadership ability.
- Very good at organising complex projects.
- Strategic thinker.

The Queensland State Co-ordinator will oversee an era of political activity in Queensland in which ACL cements itself as one of Australia's largest and most politically effective third-party campaign movements.
