# Licensing inspectors of local council 

## Power and key roles

- Inquire and provide report on the licence application meeting the criteria of the Act
- Power of entry to any licensed premises for inspection
- Power to request any information/document required by the Act
- Power to seizure any sample of alcohol at the time of inspection
- Power to issue infringement notice and prosecution
- Order the closure of licensed premises when riot, fight, serious disorder and serious threat to public health/safety, etc.
- Liaise with event organiser for large-scale event (special licence)
- Advise ARLA when a licensee or manager has been convicted of an offence relating to
- the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons, or
- allowing persons to become intoxicated
- Inquire and provide report on the licence application meeting the criteria of the Act
- MOoH has a statutory reporting role to DLCs and ARLA
- May delegate powers and functions to qualified trained person
- Apply to ARLA for suspension of an onlicence or a club licence where there is evidence of non-compliance with section 21B of the Fire Service Act 1975 (provide and maintain an evacuation scheme in the case of fire incidence)
- Inquire and provide report on the licence application meeting the criteria of the Act
- Power of entry to any licensed premises
- Power to seize alcohol and containers without a warrant for the purpose of analysis
- Monitor licensed premises compliance with the Act
- Work with the Police and event organiser for large-scale event (special licence)
- Apply to ARLA for variation, suspension and cancellation of licences and manager's certificate
