

The Middle East Peace Process

- Recalling its previous resolutions on the Middle East peace process;
- Shocked by the vicious terrorist attacks against innocent civilians in Jerusalem
- Concerned at the impact of these terrorist attacks on the continuation of the peace process
- Recalling the long-standing Israeli policy of not giving in to terrorism;

1. Is appalled by the suicide bomb attacks in the centre of Jerusalem in which innocent civilians were killed and injured.

2. Condemns the perpetrators of these atrocities, whose aim it is to sabotage the peace process;

3. Expresses its condolences to the relatives of the victims of this cowardly attack.

4. Urges the Palestinian Authority to do all in its power to suppress the terrorist organisations operating from within its territory.

5. Reaffirms that there can be no peace without security, but equally that there can be no security without peace;

6. Urges the Israeli government not to suspend the peace process in response to the attacks since this would be tantamount to giving way to terrorism.

7. Appeals to both the Israeli government and the Palestinian Authority to continue to work with the US and the EU in finding solutions to the outstanding issues.

8. Urges both parties to adhere to the Oslo agreements in letter and in spirit and work in good faith towards its implementation in full;
