WHAT YOUR VOTE MEANS

BALLOT QUESTION #1

A **YES** Vote Means:

A majority of PA state lawmakers, elected by the people, can vote to end emergency declarations and restrictions on citizens.

A **NO** Vote Means:

A governor, alone, holds the power to continue emergency restrictions indefinitely even if a legislative majority votes to end them.

BALLOT QUESTION #2

A **YES** Vote Means:

Emergency declarations limited to 21 days unless the General Assembly, elected by the people, approves longer.

A **NO** Vote Means:

A governor, alone, can extend declarations, including "emergency" provisions, business closures, and restrictions indefinitely.
