## Major Opportunity For Scots Exports

Also this month the European Commission published a revised funding package for the promotion of agricultural products, which could be a "major opportunity for Scottish exports".

Although eligible schemes can target both the internal market and third countries, the Commission, as part of a new targeted strategy, wants to focus on external markets, with a higher EU funding rate and an aim to spend 75% of the budget on these measures, coordinated with potential free trade deals.

This is a golden age for Scotland's food and drink, thanks to the determined efforts of the Scottish Government to support expansion of the sector through our first ever National Food and Drink Strategy. Overall food and drink exports increased from £3.7 billion in 2007 to £5.3 billion in 2011, while our red meat exports beyond the UK increased from £38m to £81m over the same period.

This fund is an added bonus for our producers and all Scottish food and drink organisations are encouraged to take the opportunity to apply.

# Aberdeen Launch Hydrogen Strategy

Aberdeen City Council has launched a new Hydrogen Strategy in Brussels.

As part of the strategy, the city has been awarded €9.3 million by the European Commission to invest in Europe's largest fleet of hydrogen-powered buses, and has also been selected to lead the development of hydrogen technologies in cities all across the North Sea Region.

Chairing the launch, Alyn was joined by Cllr Barney Crockett (Leader of Aberdeen City Council) and Tudor Constantinescu (Principle Adviser to the European Energy Commissioner) to discuss what the new strategy means for the development of hydrogen economies across Europe.

As Europe's biggest energy hub with a pre-existing energy infrastructure, Aberdeen is uniquely well-placed to lead the development of hydrogen technology. The funding that Aberdeen has secured is a shining example of how a city can gain recognition across Europe for its expertise simply by being proactive in the EU arena.

## In Brief

**The European Parliament voted earlier this month** to extend the EU's Generalised System of Preferences ("GSP+") to ten non-EU countries, including Pakistan. GSP+ grants additional trade preferences to countries which commit to human and labour rights, protect the environment and promote good governance. The extension of GSP+ to Pakistan is good news for Scotland, the EU and Pakistan itself in terms of trade, but also in terms of raising standards in Pakistan. It is a real world example of EU "soft power" encouraging long term change and progress, not by guns and tanks and bombs but by quiet effective diplomacy.


**Alyn visited the United Nations in November** to meet with a number of ambassadors and bureaucrats to discuss a host of issues. Of course, Scottish independence was discussed and there's no doubt that when we do take up our seat inside the General Assembly, we'll be welcomed with open arms.

**Edinburgh Airport has secured a number of new direct routes** over the past year. Direct routes to New York and Toronto are already in operation and it's been announced that from next year, two new direct flights will operate to Chicago and Philadelphia. Both routes will bring a significant economic boost to the country and also open up Scotland to a number of new destinations with Chicago, Toronto and New York all acting as major transport hubs.

**€70 billion in EU funds are now up for grabs** for Scotland's scientists and small businesses and there's an online guide to find out how to claim a share of it. As part of Horizon 2020, the EU's new funding programme for research and innovation, the funding will support development across a number of sectors.
