Dear City Prosecutor Ken Raines,

We are Janelle Babington and Penny Eims, animal welfare petitioners with AnimalVictory.org. We recently created a petition on behalf of Echo, a dog who was brutally beaten with a broomstick by 20-year-old Adam Callaghan. Echo's family learned of the ongoing, systemic abuse of their dog thanks to home surveillance video. The video evidence, coupled with reports from the family's veterinarian, reveal the extent of harm this innocent dog suffered at Callaghan's hands.

Echo's veterinary case history reveals that he suffered with swollen eyes, hip pain, nose bleeds, mental depression, lethargy, mouth injuries, swelling, and bruising. Veterinary notes indicate that the injuries were consistent with blunt force trauma. Despite the video evidence, and the expert veterinary documentation, Callaghan is only facing a misdemeanor charge.

Nearly 9,400 people have signed our petition (see below) asking for Callaghan to be charged with felony animal cruelty. We hope to see him given the maximum penalty afforded by law, and prohibited from ever owning an animal in the future. We look forward to hearing back from you about the status of this important animal cruelty case. Thank you for your time and consideration.
