Dear Prosecutor J. Patrick Vincent,

We are Janelle Babington and Penny Eims, animal welfare petitioners with AnimalVictory.org. We have created a petition asking for Elmer James Givens Jr. to be held accountable for his treatment of dozens of dogs which were found living in poor conditions at his Pierce County residence. As you are aware, the authorities have seized dogs from this man's property on multiple occasions.

18,000 people have signed our petition (please see link below for signatures and comments) asking for Givens to not only be denied his rights to these dogs, but to face charges for the conditions they were found in, and to be prohibited from ever owning dogs in the future. It is our understanding that the authorities have found strong evidence of dog fighting and it is our hope that Givens will face the appropriate charges for his participation in the detestable "blood sport."

We look forward to hearing back from your office about this important animal cruelty case. Thank you for your time and consideration.
