To Whom It May Concern:

We are Janelle Babington and Penny Eims, animal welfare petitioners with AnimalVictory.org. We have created a petition asking for a full investigation into the death of a dog who was found frozen inside of a wire cage. The pit bull had no obvious signs of trauma and there is strong speculation that the dog froze to death in the cold.

4717 people have signed our petition within 24 hours. There is a great deal of confusion, and anger, over the fact that seemingly no effort was put into finding out who is behind the abandonment of this dog. We urge you to read the comments from supporters of the petition.

In cities across the nation, animal control agencies and/or law enforcement agencies are known to reach out to the public for tips to help solve animal cruelty cases that are similar to the case involving the dog found deceased in the discarded cage. In fact, many of these agencies even offer a reward to help solve the cruelty cases.

In early 2019, a puppy was found inside of a cage submerged the water in West Milford, New Jersey. Thanks to tips from the public, Tonya Fea was identified as the person responsible for the pup's death.

Recently, a malnourished dog, locked in a cage, was discovered in a Wichita, Kansas, apartment complex dumpster. Again, thanks to the opening of an investigation, and tips from the public, an arrest was made and Raykesha Hardyway is now facing charges. Similar cases have been solved in most every area of the nation - because investigations were instigated and the public was involved.

We look forward to hearing back from your agency with an explanation as to why there was no effort to retrieve tips from the public to help make an arrest in this disturbing case of apparent animal cruelty. Additionally, we would also like your assurance that ALL future cases of possible animal cruelty will be fully investigated by your agency.
