



# 2019 ASH Year 10 Snapshot


## Topline Results – Smoking



80.4% of Year 10 students in NZ report **never smoking**




5.9% of Year 10 students in NZ report **regular smoking**




2.1% of Year 10 students in NZ report **daily smoking**

**Never smoking:** Students who report having never smoked a cigarette.  
**Regular smoking:** Students who report smoking daily, weekly, or monthly.  
**Daily smoking:** Students who report smoking at least once a day.

### Overall daily smoking rates continue to be very low




### Māori and Pacific daily smoking remains disproportionately high



Daily smoking rates for Māori and Pacific students are markedly higher than for participants of other ethnicities (non-Māori non-Pacific).

In 2019 daily smoking rates for Māori students are over 5 times higher than for non-Māori non-Pacific, with Māori girls reporting the highest daily smoking rates.
