

Union Aid Abroad - APHEDA's **Budget Breakdown**

Aid for trade up to 19.5% of total aid budget in this budget, 20% by 2020.

\$80 million cut to the UN global health programs budget. Budget statement makes global health a priority within the country programs, with a portion of the health budget to be delivered through global public private partnerships.

Funds to multi-country gender equality budget increased by \$20 million.

Contribution to the Green Climate fund reduced by \$40 million. This is despite claiming that the Pacific is a priority area under the budget. Fiji funds increased by almost \$20 million - nominally for Cyclone Winston.

DIBP drops from 7.5 to 3.3 million - the funds are for the program to counter people - smuggling, and to support the Bali process.

AFP drops from 120 to 110 million - most of this is East Timor, and Solomon Islands etc.

Other country programs maintain the same budget as in 2015/16. This is effectively a cut, because it means **budget hasn't kept track with inflation.**

\$220 million for humanitarian assistance to Syria over 3 years.

Africa aid budget includes money for extractives.

On page 68 - O.D.A delivered by other government departments.

Defence is not listed as delivering ODA (this was a point of concern, as in the last week or so defence spending has been redefined as an area for aid spending).
