What I will bring to Council

Advocacy and community engagement

I have spent two terms on the ACF Council and over that 6 years I have attended almost every meeting and many other ACF events. I am also an active member of the ACF Adelaide community group. I have joined in ACF election campaigning, collected signatures on petiti, met with state and Federal MPs, had published an op ed in the Australian Financial Review on the need for a price on carbon. I lead an Academy program on climate change.

Governance interest and experience

I have been a member of the board of a number of enterprises, in the fields of high pressure natural gas pipelines, venture capital, intellectual property. I have served on many advisory boards for State and Federal governments. I was President of the Academy of the Social Sciences. I know about good governance and what is necessary to attain it.
