Over 200 clergy and leaders from [Central Texas Interfaith](#) congregations will be adopting 16 precincts with large numbers of low-propensity voters to increase turnout for the November elections. Precincts selected were based on lower than average turnout, proximity to CTI’s congregations, and location within competitive Congressional and Texas House Races in Williamson, Travis, and Hays County. These include:

Travis County

East Austin	Precincts 124, 151, 117, 105	(US Cong Dists 25, 35, and 10)
Central Austin	Precincts 202, 274, 277	(US Cong Dists 25 and 21)
South Austin	Precincts 424, 420, 433	(US Cong Dist 21)
Western Travis County	Precincts 221, 359	(US Cong Dist 25; Texas House 47 and 48)

Williamson County

Cedar Park	Precinct 274	(US Cong Dist 31; Texas House 136)
Round Rock	Precinct 455	(US Cong Dist 31; Texas House 52)

Hays County

Buda	Precinct 224	(US Cong Dist 21; Texas House 45)
San Marcos	Precinct 330	(US Cong Dist 21; Texas House 45)

“These Congressional and Texas House Districts are highly competitive and will come down to turnout in a few precincts. We have trained over 125 leaders and have commitments for over 200 volunteer phone-bankers to conduct what we believe is the largest non-partisan Get Out The Vote Campaign in Central Texas. As a non-partisan political organization, the more votes we can get out in competitive district, the more likely both candidates will come to our [agenda of issues](#),” said Fr. Miles Brandon, Rector of St. Julian of Norwich Episcopal Church in Round Rock.

CTI’s precinct efforts will target newly registered voters, infrequent voters, and voters who can be persuaded to support its [agenda](#). CTI’s GOTV efforts are part of a larger effort to deliver 35,000 voters to the polls around its [non-partisan agenda of issues](#).
