The Fort Langley Community Improvement Society was founded by the Fort Langley Women's Institute in 1924 in order to build the Community Hall. The building was completed in 1931. The architect was Archibald Campbell Hope, brother of Fort Langley entrepreneur Charles Hope. The Hall was built and continues to be owned and maintained by society volunteers. The maple trees were planted by members of the society; men planted the trees on the north and women planted the trees on the south. The Hall was officially designated as a Municipal Heritage Site in 1979. Currently, the Community Hall is a popular site for weddings, movies and special events of all kinds.
