BC Corrections Violence Statistics (2011-2016)

The statistics are from the Integrated Corrections Operation Network (ICON). In 2008, the Corrections Branch began using a new automated system to capture violence statistics. This new information system, ICON, has business intelligence that records and reports violence statistics. The violence statistics are derived directly from incident reports completed electronically by the persons involved in the incident. The automated systematic reporting mechanism in use reduces the number of people involved in capturing the statistics and the opportunity for errors, and produces more accurate figures than the statistics that were manually calculated and reported in previous years.
