Women in Secularism conference in Vancouver 2017 Nov in alliance with CFI is coming no date or speakers yet, but is in planning stage.

Looking for a new venue for Sunday meetings.

Working on updating affiliate agreements with other local humanist groups.

Fellowship – Solstice dinner, picnics, small family friendly events

Service – Blood drive, Light the night, coat drive, refugee sponsorship (\$25k collected, working on getting a family settled in Canada)

Ceremonies – Ian officiated a friend's marriage with Lorrie Williams as the official document signer. Working on getting our own officiants under the sponsorship of BCHA. Officiant course coming next weekend (ending 8 May 2016). Especially important for funerals for atheists who really don't want clergy.

Working on getting humanist marriage officiants recognized legally with a pro bono paralegal in Victoria.

Humanist chaplains at universities and colleges

Public advocacy against incursion of bible distributions and the like in public schools.

Secular options to AA

Trinity Western fight to not accredit their law school

Change words to O Canada to get rid of references to God.

Fund raising 152 separate people gave us money this past year.

New bylaws may be needed for the new BC Society Act

Privacy policy on the website is implemented and available on the site.

Need to continue to expand the board in terms of numbers and capabilities

Communications policy adopted. All external contacts go through Executive Director, complains about Ex. Dir. Go to president.

Membership is now officially from date of payment to one year after that. Automatic renewal reminders will be sent out by Nationbuilder.

Writing policy manual for multi-faith office to ensure secular inclusive terms are used there.

Treasurer's report: Colin Crabbe.

Revenue up significantly from last year. Ran a small loss last year. This year we're \$4k ahead of expenses for the year. Figures in report are as of 31 Dec 2015. See report below for details.

Looking at better accounting software.

We are not financially involved nor exposed to expenses with INR6.

Canada Helps is the optimal way to give us money. Automatic tax receipts sent out by them.

Paypal is for event admission payments, Canada helps is optimal for donations in order to minimize accounting workload for Colin. Event admissions and any other payments for which the payer receives "something" are not eligible for charitable contribution tax deductions receipts.
