

6. MAIL-IN BALLOT TRANSPARENCY

1 **WHEREAS**, the State of Wisconsin has several types of mail-in ballots; and

3 **WHEREAS**, there currently exists no transparent means to determine how many mail-in
4 ballots are in circulation and, specifically, how many have been mailed out, received and
5 remain in circulation as of the day before an election; and

7 **WHEREAS**, State Statute 7.52(1) (a) prevents the clerks from processing mail-in ballots
8 prior to election day; now, therefore, be it

10 **RESOLVED**, That the Republican Party of Wisconsin's Eighth Congressional District, in
11 Caucus Assembled, determines that to achieve transparency of mail-in ballots, clerks
12 should be required by Statute to make available to the public, their tallies of all certified
13 mail-in ballots as polls open on election day. This is to include all information relating
14 to Absentee Voter Requests and the total number of ballots mailed out, received to-
15 date, outstanding, military, determined uncertified, etc.
