The fact-finding panel report released in December 2018 points the way towards a workable solution for all parties. We implore you to spend as much time as needed working together to reach an agreement.

We need to move beyond this standoff to focus on what's truly important: getting our students what they need and deserve. As business leaders, we focus on solutions. We stand ready to work with you to advocate for increased educational funding from Sacramento and Washington. We believe we need to work together to engage our communities in long term solutions rather than putting them through the trauma of a strike.
