

Bordentown Township Residents: Got Brush? Call for Pick-Ups! 609-291-2133

Scheduled Brush pick-ups take place every Tuesday from February – October

How it Works:

Call Public Works NO LATER than 3 p.m. Monday.

Have your brush piles on your curb no later than Tuesday at 7 a.m.

Calls received after 3 p.m. on Monday will be put on the following week's schedule – no exceptions.

What We Will Pick Up:

SCHEDULED brush piles only.

Any organic matter that has been cut or fallen from trees and shrubs measuring no more than 8" in diameter and 6' in length.

Piles containing one material type only.

Manageable Piles no more than 4' x 6'.

What We Will NOT Pick Up:

Trees or branches not cut down to the required size.

Contractor-cut trees or materials.

Leaves, stumps, and rocks.

Oversize brush piles.

More than one, 4' x 6' pile of brush per week.

Ornamental grass (ex: maiden grass or morning light grass) is not considered brush and should be included in grass clippings.

Brush put out on curbs in November, December and January.

Any inorganic material, including fence material, plywood, lumber or other treated wood.

Piles bundled with rope or twine.



Where to Bring Cut Down Trees:

The Burlington County Resource Recovery Complex, 22000 Burlington Columbus Road (609-499-5300). Any trees that have been cut down by a contractor will not be included with brush pick up and are the responsibility of the resident and/or contractor to remove.

If You Would Like to Remove Your Own Brush:

Bring the material to the Municipal Service Complex, 266 Crosswicks Road Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., and Saturday between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m.

All residents MUST check in at the office prior to leaving any material.

There will be NO brush pick up in November, December, and January due to leaf collection and Christmas tree pick up. Brush may still be brought to the Municipal Service Complex during these months.
