1. **SALUTE TO FLAG:** Vice-Chair Lozito called the meeting to order at 7:55 PM and led those present in a salute to the flag.
2. **OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ANNOUNCEMENT BY CHAIRMAN:** In compliance with the open Public Meetings Act, this is to announce that adequate notice of this meeting was provided in the following manner: On January 31, 2018 advance written notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board opposite the main entrance of the meeting room in the Municipal Building; was mailed to the Register-News and the Burlington County Times; was filed with the Clerk of Bordentown Township, and was mailed to all persons who requested and paid for such notice
3. **MINUTES:** Minutes from the August 28 meeting were adopted with Chairman Plew abstaining.
4. **LIAISON REPORT:** Deputy Mayor Fuzy advised that there was a \$55 overage in the order for the shopping bags. Members voted to accept the overage. Bordentown Township Police will be at Starbucks for Coffee with a Cop on Sept. 29 and kick off the Street Smart pedestrian safety program on Oct. 1. The Township's new website has been completed.
5. **NEW BUSINESS:** Members discussed the correspondence concerning the Freshwater Wetlands General Permit 12. It was decided that the EC would purchase 5 – five dollar gift cards as prizes for the Green Challenge. Members voted to sign onto the Environment NJ letter. Judy Berkeyheiser won the drawing for the rain barrel from the entries collected on Community Day.
6. **FOR DISCUSSION:** Mrs. Lozito discussed the upcoming Lead Education session to be held at Carslake Community Center on Oct. 15 at 7:00 PM. Shredder Day will be held at the Public Works facility on Oct. 13. Participation in Wailing Woods will be dependent upon the availability of volunteers who have helped in the past. The Terra Cycle Project will begin with the collection of toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, and dental floss containers with receptacles placed in the schools. Members voted to allow \$40 for printing services to support EC activities.
