The Regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Bordentown was held in the Main Meeting Room in the Municipal Building.

Mayor Benowitz called the meeting to order at approximately 6:34 p.m. and led a salute to the flag and a moment of silence. He dedicated the moment of silence to Donald Smieszek who was a veteran in the Vietnam War, member of the Veteran's Advisory Committee, and the Home Town Hero in 2017. The moment of silence is also being dedicated to Stephen Turgyan who was an exemplary resident, who farmed land in the Township for numerous years, and was noted for assisting the Township, including events.

JOHN McLOUGHLIN, representing Jean and Stan Gendek: Mr. McLoughlin requested that the Township not pass Ordinance #2018-3 because Jean and Stan Gendek will lose parking for one of their cars in front of their house and will have to park further up the block. Mr. McLoughlin said he believes there is a way to fix the problem by increasing access to the neighbor's driveway. They think that extending the no parking zone by 8 feet allows the neighbor (a former mayor) greater access to his driveway. Mr. McLoughlin presented some photos with his suggested solution and asked that the ordinance be amended.

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FRED TUREK, Township Engineer: Township Engineer Turek referred to his report dated August 21, 2017 and explained the present scenario at 18 and 20 Bonnie Lane. Township Traffic Engineer Kochenour, Township Engineer Turek, and other Township Professionals went out and reviewed the situation and determined this as a public safety issue.

JOHN McLOUGHLIN, representing Jean and Stan Gendek: Mr. McLoughlin said that moving a car 8 feet away from where it is now, is not going to affect the firetruck. He stated that his OPRA request was denied when he asked to receive copies of what was received from the fire chief. Attorney Fahey said that it was withheld under an OPRA exemption. She added that he was going beyond a public hearing on an ordinance and into a cross examination.

COMMITTEEMAN KOSTOPLIS: Committeeman Kostoplis asked Township Engineer Turek what a firetruck has to do to go down Bonnie Lane and come back out. Township Engineer Turek responded that they back out using the resident's driveway.

EDWARD FRYC, 21 Bonnie Lane: Mr. Fryc stated that he didn't think the ordinance was a good idea because his kids are going to be driving soon. The public safety issue is very important to him, but where will his kids be able to park? Mr. Gendek will have to take over other spots if he loses a portion of his front parking. He said the firetruck has had no problem going down the street in the past.

JEFF GENDEK, 8 Bonnie Lane (Jean and Stan Gendek's son): Mr. Gendek asked if the Township Committee was aware of the current stripe installed in front of 20 Bonnie Lane and which agenda of the Zoning Board was this approved. He said his parents were never notified of the stripe and it was disguised as a traffic issue, when in fact it was a zoning issue. He asked what traffic study was completed prior to the stripe being installed and who approved it. Attorney Fahey clarified that this is not a zoning issue and there is an assumption being made that certain studies are required, which is not necessarily the case. Documents requested through OPRA have been prepared and provided to Mr. and Mrs. Gendek or Mr. McLoughlin. Mr. Gendek asked for the purpose of the change in the ordinance. Mayor Benowitz responded it is a public safety issue. Mr. Gendek asked that this Ordinance #2018-3 not be approved.

ATTORNEY FAHEY: Attorney Fahey clarified that this is a public hearing; it is not an open dialogue. The difference is statements are heard, the Township Committee does not have to engage in any kind of discussion.

JEAN GENDEK, 20 Bonnie Lane: Ms. Gendek repeated a conversation she said she had with Township Engineer Turek. She discussed the irregularity of the driveway situation and said she didn't believe that there is a safety issue.

MARTIN BIAZZO, 19 Bonnie Lane: Mr. Biazzo asked that the yellow lines not be longer than 25 feet from the corner.

COMMITTEEMAN KOSTOPLIS: Committeeman Kostoplis asked how old the house was. Township Engineer Turek responded that the house was built in the mid-1950s.

LEN de GROOT, 8 Arlington Road: Mr. de Groot asked if the curves on Bonnie Lane could be rounded. Township Engineer Turek responded there is not enough right of way to do this.

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CHRIS DE LAY, 12 Bonnie Lane: Mr. De Lay said the situation has been like this for 61 years. He asked if the public safety issue was brought forward because of the resident at 18 Bonnie Lane. Mayor Benowitz responded, no.

TONY D'ANGELO (Nick D'Angelo's son), 10 Locust Road: Mr. D'Angelo said parking is very tight on Locus Road. He suggested the Gendeks add a small side parking space adjacent to their driveway, which is what he did at his home.

STANLEY GENDEK, 20 Bonnie Lane: Mr. Gendek said the firetruck and garbage trucks travel on Bonnie Lane with no problem and he sees no safety issues.
