BURLINGTON COUNTY PROJECT LIFESAVER CARE GIVER INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Check the transmitter every day with the tester provided. Sign and date the tester sheet. If a problem exists or the transmitter is not indicating transmission (no pulsing or steady, glowing red light), notify us immediately.
- 2. If the patient is missing, first check obvious places around the home. If not located within a few minutes, call 911.

Be sure to tell them you are part of the Burlington County Project Lifesaver Program

- A. If you are at home, the local police will contact you to file a missing persons report and we will call you back while we are responding to begin a search.
- B. If the patient lives out-of-town or you are away from home, notify the local police department of the town where the patient is to be reported missing immediately via the 911 system. Provide the police with a good description including clothing. Carrying a current picture is helpful. Remember to leave a phone number where you can be reached and stay near the phone.

C. After the local police have been notified, call Burlington County Central Communications at (609) 265-7105. Notify the police communications operator of the name of the missing Project Lifesaver Client, your name, and provide a telephone number where you can be reached. Ask the communications operator to contact a Burlington County Project Lifesaver Supervisor of the missing client. We will call you back with information as to how we can help with the search.

For non-emergencies such as transmitter/band maintenance or you find the transmitter is not working with your tester, call the numbers below:
