**WHEREAS**, Donald W. Mohr was born in Weehawaken New Jersey and grew up in Hoboken New Jersey and moved to Bordentown in 1971 and returned again in 1977 and is currently a resident today. He has three children who are, Keith, Melissa, Kelly, and three Grandchildren who are Katelyn, Ashley and Myles; and

**WHEREAS**, Donald was drafted in November 1966 and began serving in the United States Army on January 17, 1967 completing his Basic Training at Fort Dix N.J. and Advanced Infantry Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, in June of 1967 Donald was deployed to the Republic of South Vietnam and assigned to II Corps in the Central Highlands in Pleiku Providence with the 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division Replacement Company then assigned as a Rifleman to the Alpha CO 1<sup>st</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> Infantry, 4<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division; and

**WHEREAS**, Donald's first field operation was in the IA Drang Valley and Cambodia as a part of Counteroffensive Phase II from 1966-1967 and Counteroffensive Phase III in 1967 until 1968 but suffered a combat assault injury in November of 1967 that required surgery and was medevac'd to the U.S. hospital in Okinawa, Japan; and

**WHEREAS**, in February of 1968 he was involved with the Battle of Kontum Operation MacArthur which continued in April of 1968 with the Battle of Chu Moor Mountain and all missions were successfully completed; and


**WHEREAS**, on June 21, 1968 Donald returned to the United States and was stationed at Fort Hood in Texas with Bravo Co 2<sup>nd</sup> 46<sup>th</sup> Infantry Mech 1<sup>st</sup> Armed Division until his discharge at the rank of Sgt. E-5 in January of 1969; and

**WHEREAS**, Donald W. Mohr received the Combat Infantry Badge, Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal with two stars, Vietnam Service Medal with Palm and many more too numerous to list; and

**WHEREAS**, Donald is a member of many organizations such American Legion Post#26, Riverside V.F.W Post 3028, Life Member of the DAV Chapter 42, VVA Chapter 899; and

**WHEREAS**, the VVA Chapter 899 chose Donald as Member of the year in 2006 and he has actively held offices in the organization, was involved in the N.J. State Council VVA as the West Central Director, participated in outreach to the Joint Base MDL from the start of Desert Storm Deployments through last demobilization in April 2015, participating in seeing off the soldiers and greeting them when they returned, helping with the Liberty USO preparing snacks and meals, visiting the Medical Hold-overs at the Warriors Transition Unit, assisting with preparing forms and paperwork and participated in the annual September N.J. Stand Down at National Guard Armory in Cherry Hill and so much more.
