## **Petition For Constitutional Amendment**

We, the undersigned registered and duly qualified electors of the State of Illinois, petition to amend Article IV, Section 3(b) of the Illinois Constitution, by placing this proposed amendment before the electors of Illinois at large by referendum at the General Election to be held on the 3rd day of November, 2020, and replacing the current Section 3(b) with the following: (b) In the year following each Federal decennial census year, a Bipartisan Commission on Legislative Redistricting having twelve members shall be constituted by March 1 of that year and shall redistrict the Legislative Districts and the Representative Districts. The Speaker and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives and President and Minority Leader of the Senate shall each appoint three persons to the Commission. The members shall be certified to the Secretary of State by the appointing authorities. A vacancy on the Commission shall be filled within five days by the authority that made the original appointment. Not later than July 1, the Commission shall file with the Secretary of State a redistricting plan approved by a majority of its members including at least one member appointed by each of the appointing authorities. An approved redistricting plan filed with the Secretary of State shall be presumed valid, shall have the force and effect of law and shall be published promptly by the Secretary of State. The Supreme Court shall have original and exclusive jurisdiction over actions concerning redistricting the House and Senate, which shall be initiated in the name of the People of the State by the Attorney General.

## Fair Maps Illinois - Petition Instructions

## **Instructions for Petition CIRCULATORS**

- 1. You must be 18 years old (or 17 years old and qualified to vote in Illinois) and a U.S. citizen. You need not live in Illinois (unless you are 17 years old). You need not be registered to vote.
- 2. Only one person may circulate each petition sheet.
- 3. Ask each person if he or she is registered to vote in Illinois.
- 4. You must personally see each voter sign the petition. Never leave a petition on a counter unattended.
- 5. Nobody may sign for another person.
- 6. You may sign the petition sheet you are circulating if you are registered to vote in Illinois.
- 7. Partially filled petition sheets count! Please turn in whatever signatures you gather.
- 8. Please do not fill in page numbers on petition sheets.
- 9. The "YES/NO" box is representative of how the amendment will appear on the ballot and does not need to be marked.
- 10. Print your name and home address in the paragraph at the bottom of the petition sheet, but **DO NOT SIGN** until you have finished circulating that sheet **AND** are in front of a notary.
- 11. <u>AFTER</u> you have finished circulating the petition, you must appear before an Illinois notary to sign as the petition circulator and have your signature notarized. <u>DO NOT SIGN as circulator until you are in front of a notary.</u> (Many banks, currency exchanges, and some libraries have a notary available).

## **Instructions for Petition SIGNERS**

- 1. You must be a registered voter at your current address AND your address must be in Illinois. Write your Rural Route number if you do not have a Street Address.
- 2. You must sign in the presence of the circulator.
- 3. You may sign only for yourself. You may not sign for a family member, friend, etc.
- 4. Sign your name as you are registered to vote (e.g. "William Smith" not "Bill Smith"). After signing, you should then legibly print your name, address, and county.
- 5. Do not use "ditto" marks.
