FRESH & LOCAL

Organic Farmer/Rancher

Organic farmers and ranchers raise crops and animals using natural methods including composting, crop rotation, nutrient cycling and animal husbandry. This profession required an intimate knowledge of the land and the natural lifecycles of agricultural plants and animals.

Chef/Professional Cook

In a restaurant a chef is responsible for planning menus, sourcing ingredients and preparing food for customers. As an accredited trade you also have to complete an apprenticeship in addition to course work. With training in the culinary arts and awareness about the importance of organic production and local food for the health of people and the environment you could help bring fresh, local and organic food to your community.
