### Keynote Speaker Dr. MaryLouise Patterson

Dr. Patterson earned her medical degree at Patrice Lumumba Friendship University in Moscow and a Masters of Public Health at the University of California - Berkeley. She works to get medical care in underserved schools, and she is a part of many civil rights, social justice and peace movements. Her family's close friendship with Langston Hughes is chronicled in the book *Letters from Langston: From the Harlem Renaissance to the Red Scare and Beyond*, which Dr. Patterson co-edited.

### 2018 Charlene Mitchell Human Rights Award Recipients

#### Bertha Escamilla

Bertha Escamilla represents the mothers and families of those who have endured decades of abuse and torture at the hands of the police and the criminal justice system. Her own son has been released, but she continues the fight for others. She pursues the torture cops relentlessly and will not stop until all the survivors are free and the cops receive justice.

#### Katie Jordan

Katie Jordan is President of the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW), Chicago Chapter. A member of the Workers United union for over 52 years, Katie Jordan has served her local as shop steward, Secretary, Vice President, and President. She was the first African American tailor fitter at Lytton's Department Store in Chicago.

#### Jamie Kalven

Jamie Kalven has reported extensively on patterns of police abuse and impunity in Chicago. His 2015 article "Sixteen Shots" first brought the police shooting of Laquan McDonald to public attention. His lawsuit, *Kalven v. Chicago*, won the ruling that the public has the right to see documents relating to allegations of police misconduct.
