As of June 2021, there are 111 GGHH members representing the interests of over 2,000 hospitals and health services across Australia and New Zealand.


Globally there are over 1,450 members from 72 countries who represent the interests of more than 43,000 hospitals and health services.

Membership: GGHH membership is free of charge for hospitals, health and aged care facilities, health systems and health organisations.
